I received much support from my Family and Friends and from Religious Sisters in promoting Venerable Mary Aikenhead! I am praying that many more young people will meet the Venerable Foundress Mary Aikenhead, and spread her Holy Life and Story to others.

A FRIEND OF MARY AIKENHEAD IN IRELAND TELLS HER STORY

My name is **Breda** Galvin and I am a member of the Cork Friends of Mary Aikenhead. There are seven of us in the group and I am happy to have assumed the role of leader. Our becoming Friends grew out of our association with the Sisters in the convent, in the schools and in the neighbourhood. Over the years we had all become very aware of the legacy of Venerable Mary Aikenhead and the manifestation of her motto "Caritas Christi Urget Nos" in the lives of

the Sisters.

The role of the Cork FMA is very much centred around the Cork Trail and bringing visitors on the trail. We had been doing this on an annual basis with the African Sisters and with members of Mary Aikenhead ministries from the Sisters of Charity of Australia until the Covid pandemic struck. I am the link person in organising the Trail from the Cork end and responsible for communicating with the Dublin Team and our group.

We enjoy bringing visitors to Mary Aikenhead's place of birth and these days are always a joyous and rewarding experience for us as Friends. Each of the Friends is encouraged to lead the story at various locations associated with her young life in Cork and to carry out their own research on that location. We end the trail with a Prayer Service in the South Chapel, the Church where, on hearing a sermon on Lazarus and Dives, the seeds of Venerable Mary Aikenhead's vocation were sown.

Sr. Helen, our leader is very encouraging and this year with her blessing I as leader, invited a new member, who teaches in the secondary school to join the Friends. Our hope is that this link with the younger generation will inspire young people to embrace the Charism of Venerable Mary Aikenhead which was "to give to the poor what the rich can buy for money". This option is still very relevant for today's world.

The formation of this group has enabled the Friends to be involved in other related activities in cooperation with the Sisters, e.g. two of the Friends volunteered to prepare the Sunday Mass for the residents of St. Vincent's Centre.

The group also offers a solidarity and a support for each member in that we are able to join in prayer with the Sisters in times of joy and sorrow and in celebrating the events marking the life of Venerable Mary Aikenhead.
